



It would also be nice to see more information published about the violation of human rights in Cuba.





Evan, you begin your email with:

"Every single point in your letter is one I have heard dozens of times before from Canadian sympathizers of the Cuban Communist Party"

One would expect to find this response spouted by an alt-right troll in the comment section following a political story on the CBC. That it would be made by one of its journalists is certainly discouraging. After reading your response, I realize that I should not have been surprised. I'll make one thing clear here. When it comes to Cuba, I take no lessons from you.

You claim honesty and objectivity and base it on the responses you have received from Cubans who have left their country to live in Canada. Here is the problem. You claim objectivity having only listened to one side of the issue. I would expect that responsible journalism would demand listening to the other side as well.

Did the recent Cuban emigres leave the hardships they faced in Cuba? No doubt. They blame the government and you accept that position without. I asked you about the effects of the American embargo. You ducked the question. Does this mean that you consider the embargo a non-factor? Here are facts that are readily available to you. The embargo is the primary cause of Cuban hardship. The American government initiated the embargo with the objective of creating considerable hardship that would result in the Cuban population rising up, overthrowing the government and replacing it with an American-friendly administration. Regime change. You ignore this reality. I could say that this "reveals your unfamiliarity with the topic," but that would be too generous. What it does reveal is the extent of your bias.

Where is your admission that the difficult condition of Cuban hospitals you attributed to the Cuban government is the result of the embargo? Where is your acknowledgement that even with the embargo, Cubans have still managed to create a health care model that compares favourably with that of any of its neighbours? I asked the question. You ducked it.

Where is the admission that your blaming the government for what you claim is a failure to "produce anything" is nonsensical? That production is dependent on trade. Trade that is severely disrupted by the embargo and by trade agreements that cause further disruption. I asked. You ducked.

Your dissident sources would probably agree with your position, but I would suggest to you that the overwhelming majority of the people in Cuba certainly do not. Your comments reflect the one-sided approach that you have taken. Good journalism would require you to speak to Cubans in Cuba. Have you even been to the country? I have. Several times. I have spoken to many everyday people in the cities and rural areas. It may come as a surprise to you but I can confidently tell you that not one would agree that your coverage is "honest and objective." Does my limited sample allow me to claim my position as fact? No. Neither does yours. But I would suggest that when it comes to representing

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the country, the words of the people who live in the country are more representative than those who chose to leave it.

When it comes to the topic of democracy, according to your words, your position is based on belief. It is kind of you to grant me the freedom to do the same. Thanks but no thanks. I base mine on facts. You obviously haven't bothered to learn about the way Cubans elect their government. Instead, you throw out the same tired tripe that ranges from incorrect to ridiculous. The 97% figure you quote comes from a parliamentary vote on a second term for the leader. Similar to Canada, the Cuban electorate do not elect their leader.

Cuba is a one party state. Your belief is that this makes it undemocratic. The Cuban electorate prove differently. In the latest general election 75% cast their ballots. They did it freely. The 25% who didn't suffered no negative consequences. You have absolutely no grounds to believe that the process is undemocratic. When you make that judgement you are simply saying that the Cuban people are misguided. That they do not know what they are doing. What you demonstrate is an ideological paternalism that shoots your credibility to hell.

Compare Cuban elections to ours. In the neighbourhood of 40% of eligible voters here do not vote. The election result is usually a majority government that attracts around 40% of that vote. What that means is that we are usually governed by a party that represents less than a quarter of the eligible voters. Add to that the fact that, largely due to financial support from wealthy donors and corporations, our federal governments have always been two parties which represent two sides of the same neoliberal coin. Considering all that, which country is the healthier democracy? The answer is not as clear as you make it out to be.

A legitimate criticism is that the Cuban leadership has too much control. You and others in our media use this fault to label the government as a dictatorship. Here in Canada, government legislation decisions are made in the PMO, no matter which party is in government. Many political scientists will tell you that Prime Minister and his circle of advisors have too much power. Is Canada a dictatorship?

Your comparison of Cuba and North Korea is ridiculous. It is another indication of your uninformed position. You are comparing apples and oranges. There is also no comparison between the Cuban Communist Party and the Chinese Communist Party. If you are really looking for a similar example, try looking at Vietnam.

You made an odd comment regarding the Miami Cuban community. What does it matter that the small first wave made up of supporters of Batista and another group of wealthy Cubans are now old? They and their expanded families continue to hold a great deal of influence.

You have labelled me as a Cuban Communist Party sympathizer. I'll accept that. I have a good deal of sympathy for a government strongly supported by the people. A government that has for almost all of its existence suffered from the results of an undeclared military and economic war not of their making.

What I am not is an apologist for Cuban government errors. Fidel's decision to take over all the country's small businesses was a huge mistake. It took too long for the government to begin to

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reverse that decision. Nevertheless, the process continues. The recently introduced Cuban Family Code legislation is also commendable; accurately described as the most progressive in the region. "These are easily verifiable facts and I invite you to look into them. It is never too late to seek out new information and question whether one really wants to" continue to so freely throw around charges of authoritarianism and oppression on the basis of nothing more than a severely skewed personal ideology.

No I do not believe that Cuba is a democracy, any more than I believe that the 97.66% vote recorded 11 days ago in favour of a second term for Miguel Diaz-Canel, with no votes against, in any way reflects the wishes of the Cuban population. You are free to believe if you wish that Cubans unanimously support one-party rule, just as you are free to wish that North Koreans really choose to vote 99% in favour of Kim Jong-Un.

Your suggestion that Cubans in exile support the Battista (sic) regime is incorrect. The vast majority of exiles left post-1960, after the 26 of July movement hijacked the revolution, broke its commitments to hold free elections, and introduced authoritarian communism. The small number of Batista supporters who left Cuba for the US, which of course did not include Batista himself who was under US sanctions and went to Franco's Spain, would all be in their late 80s by now, at the youngest. Your suggestion that "most of the criticism" of the Cuban regime comes from this tiny segment of the exile population reveals your unfamiliarity with the topic.

The dissidents in Canada are all people who were born and raised under Communist rule in Cuba, and who left as adults. The same is true of the vast majority of exiles in the US.

These are easily verifiable facts and I invite you to look into them. It is never too late to seek out new information and question whether one really wants to be involved in supporting authoritarian regimes that oppress their people.

Canadian says she was barred from seeing family in Cuba for criticizing the government A responsible journalist would have insisted that this story would be posted as an opinion. To see the degree of bias in this article emanating from a CBC reporter is disappointing.

Here are a few points for your consideration.

You equate democracy with a multiparty system. Have you considered surveying Canadians about the state of democracy in this country? Have you looked at the state of democracy in the haven of the "free world" south of the border? You state that the Cuban government is "unelected." You might try a little research here. You would find that, not only are there elections, the participation rate is far superior to what we have here. Arguably, Cuban governments are far more representative than ours.

You refer to the country's "repressive" state organs. On what basis for you make this judgement?

Apparently, you have determined that Cuba's hospitals are in a state of neglect. Do you have solid evidence of neglect? Are their hospitals as well equipped as ours? No. Have you bothered explaining the the reason for this is the American embargo. An embargo which has been continually condemned by the United Nations? No. Have you considered the reality that, when it comes to the state of providing medicare to its citizens, Cuba does a better job than Canada?

You state that the country's production of goods is negligible. Again, you ignore the embargo. Are you aware that Cuban medical experts came up with six vaccines that effectively prevented Covid infections? How many did Canada produce? Why didn't Canada enter into an agreement with Cuba regarding vaccine production? How much money could have been saved. Cuba produces some of the best rum in the world. None of it appears on Canadian shelves.

You raise the issue of the Cuban government's handling of what were clearly anti-government demonstrations.

Not too long ago our leaders sent in the police to break up a demonstration in Ottawa. Police rode horses into demonstrators. The the response was justified, in part, on a farcical claim that the truckers' occupation presented a threat to our democracy. I don't recall seeing an article where you criticised the brutality if the response. Balance might be considered.
