#### Hello Evan Dyer,

I am emailing you regarding your publications on Cuba, and I want to thank you. It is much appreciated as many journalists do not have it on their radar.

I am a proud Canadian with Cuban orgin and I cannot help but feel disappointed when I see so many Canadians vacationing in Cuba, involuntarily supporting the Cuban dictatorship.

As you mentioned in your past reports, I also believe that while Canadians help Cubans, in the short term, by giving them gifts and tips while at resorts, the Cuban society, as a whole, benefits very little. Cubans deserve better than that. They deserve democracy, freedom, and the chance to try to develop and build the same.

I believe that your reports are a way to also warn Canadians that Cuba is becoming less safe as a destination, to vacation at. Corruption can be seen everywhere, and tourists don't think about the ways they could receive bad service or possibly served something unsafe. For example, I don't buy Cuban rum anymore when I visit, as they have black market business's with many products like rum, coffee and beer. Factory workers often steal materials and official labels from their workplace. They take them home and make a similiar concoction that looks the same as the regular product that you can see everywhere including at the airport, therefore you could easily buy fraudulent products that are not following any food safety rules.

It would also be nice to see more information published about the violation of human rights in Cuba.

The Cuban authoritarian regime has indoctrinated, not only their own people, but also those in most countries of the world. The propaganda machine has been very effective. Many Canadians still believe that all the problems in Cuba are due to the embargo, and that there is equality and justice in Cuba.

Right now the country is collapsing, and nothing is functioning. For example, the Cuban people have no food, no medicine, daily black outs, and loss of water supply. Hospitals are in terrible condition and unable to operate to minimum standards. At the same time, the Castro family, the so call president and small groups of their loyals are living a good life, full of privileges.

Prisoner defenders reported, last month, a total of 1,066 people as political prisoners. As you would know, they have incarcerated minors as well. The repression is brutal for people who protest. The atrocities officials are committing are inconcible.

Thank you also for publishing the news about the Cuban-Canadian woman who was barred from Cuba over FB posts. That unfortunately has happened before. All of us who raise our voices to condemn the injustices and call for the end of the dictatorship are taking the same risk.

I would like to ask you a favor. It will be very helpful if you call out the regime for what it is. It is not a government, nobody has elected them. Cubans have not been able to elect a government in more than 64 years. It is a dictatorship, and sadly, a very long one. Your work is very important to us.







Hello Mr. Dyer,

I thank you for your rapid, detailed reply. I am sorry if my email appeared rude to you. But I am not convinced by your explanation. It does not take long to find reliable academic and international sources that also disagree with what you maintain in arguing that the 60-year U.S. embargo has had no effect on the current problematic situation in Cuba.

Here is just one excerpt from the attached article that highlights reports from UN agencies. Gordon, 2015, p. 475: "For the last two decades, an array of UN agencies and other international organizations have reported on the effects of the embargo. UN staff reported that the US embargo "constitute[s] a major handicap for the further development of the economy in general and for the needed rehabilitation of its infrastructure in particular." (UN Resident Coordinator, 2000, p.24) This occurred in several ways. "Cuban export products are prevented from entering the United States market, the largest in the region and the closest to Cuba, and the sale of products to Cuba by both companies located in United States territory and their subsidiaries abroad is forbidden, all of which drives up shipping costs, makes it necessary to turn to third markets or intermediaries, perpetuates the so-called 'Cuba risk,' prohibits the use of the United States dollar in business transactions with Cuba and limits the acquisition of new technologies or goods." (UN Resident Coordinator, 2003, p.69) The damage to the economy, in turn, "represents a major obstacle and a stranglehold on the overall development of the country. Because it affects several facets of the economy of the country, it poses severe negative effects on the quality of life of the population as a whole, particularly the most vulnerable sectors and particularly in the areas of health and education." (UN Resident Coordinator, 2001, p.35).

Again, I apologize for the rude tone of my email, but I find it troubling when what I consider relevant facts are omitted from the story, especially since some readers may have little or no awareness of this 'stranglehold' on Cuba's development, as reported by the UN coordinator in the preceding paragraph.

It is neither. It is a deliberate decision not to focus on extraneous matters that have nothing to do with the case at hand.

Your rude question takes for granted that, without the US embargo, Cuba would be a prosperous nation capable of providing for its citizens. There is no evidence of this whatsoever and much evidence to the contrary, since the Cuban Communist Party has rigidly pursued an economic model that has led to national impoverishment in every instance where it has been applied, from Albania to Zimbabwe, with or without sanctions.

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Eight million people have also had to flee Venezuela as a result of an economic meltdown that began without any national sanctions, the largest out-migration in the world from what was once a wealthy country.

If supporters of the Cuban model could point to a single example where a communist command economy has produced anything other than economic stagnation followed by economic breakdown, I think a case could be made that Cuba might have flourished without sanctions. However, no such example exists. The Soviet Union itself ended because of economic collapse. The Chinese Communist Party survived only by abandoning the Communist economic model. All that remains of communism in China and Vietnam is the political aspect of one-party authoritarianism; both are free market economies. North Korea persisted with a Cuban-style command economy and is in famine.

You mention the 60 years of the US embargo, but ignore the fact that the last 60 years of Cuban history also included 30 years of generous subsidies and assistance from the world's other superpower, the Soviet Union, and then a further 15 years with oil-rich Venezuela acting the role of Cuba's sugar daddy. Both governments only stopped supporting Cuba because their own economies collapsed as a result of trying to implement similar policies.

By the way, since you are giving me suggestions, I think you should probably care more about the fact that the Cuban Communist Party runs a dictatorship that does not allow free elections, and locks its young people up for thinking differently.

But I have come to realize that this aspect of Cuba is just not an issue for the Cuban Communist Party's Canadian admirers, authoritarians who care little for democracy or for the Cuban people.



Of course CBSA, like all countries, denies entry on occasion to *non-citizens* who do not qualify for entry.

As expected, you are not able to provide a single example of a *Canadian* denied entry to Canada. That is because it does not happen. Canadians are constitutionally guaranteed entry to their country under all circumstances, no exceptions. Canada just put its own public servants at risk to facilitate the return of ISIS members who wilfully destroyed their passports and declared war on this country. Would you like to try again and see if you can find a single example of an American denied entry to the United States for their political opinions? You will not be able to for the same reason: it doesn't happen.

There are Americans who would face arrest for crimes they committed if they returned home, but they would still be allowed to enter.

Your claims about Canada supporting the US embargo are equally false. 



That is exactly the position you support for Cuba, so I presume you are consistent when it comes to your own country.



Hi Evan, I have not read your Cuba column yet but did read the Kimber column — which was not worth reading. You are probably correct about democracies generally not refusing entry of their own citizens for political reasons, but "the public good" is arguably "political" and the UK law allows deprivation without notice, etc. to in fact prevent entry.

- The UK has stripped 212 people of citizenship on national security grounds since 2010. Based on available records this is more than any other country asides from Bahrain (434) which has a controversial human rights record. The next worst countries were the United Arab Emirates (62), Belgium (52), the Netherlands (21), France (16), Australia (12).
- Since 9/11, nationality deprivation laws have been introduced or expanded in 1 in 5 countries globally, to allow for removal of citizenship to purportedly counter terrorism and protect national security. Many countries also allow for deprivation even when it will cause someone to become stateless, which is illegal. The laws use vague language which greatly increase the discretion of the relevant authority and in the UK citizenship can be removed at the whim of the Home Secretary, without judicial oversight." <a href="https://www.mdx.ac.uk/news/2022/03/citizenship-UK-nationality-borders-bill">https://www.mdx.ac.uk/news/2022/03/citizenship-UK-nationality-borders-bill</a>

"The Home Secretary has the power to take away a person's British citizenship if they consider it conducive to the public good, or if the person obtained their citizenship by fraud. The power of citizenship deprivation is in section 40 of the British Nationality Act 1981.

Deprivation of citizenship happens for national security reasons or in cases of fraud

Depriving someone of their British citizenship for the public good is almost always used in the context of national security. The aim is to prevent a person who poses a threat to the United Kingdom from returning to the country, which they would otherwise have a right to do as a British citizen.

For people who have naturalised as British, deprivation of citizenship is permitted even if it would leave them stateless (ie without the citizenship of any country). Someone who was born British and has no other nationality cannot be deprived of their citizenship in any circumstances."
